We have had a fabulous educational week of fun and engagement. The 3 caterpillars I brought to school from my grapefruit tree have been a wonderful source of entertainment and learning. Through a camera snapshot and research, we have discovered they will change into Orchard Swallowtail



Butterflies. We look forward to logging their life cycle journey as they grow and change in front of our eyes. Liliana has brought stink beetles from her lemon tree and Heidi a beautiful Monarch butterfly. So much interesting information to learn and study.

Preps and Year 1's are loving sharing their 'Special Place' with our class in our oral speaking sessions, including Show & Tell. This develops public speaking confidence and language skills. During 'Social Play' this week, students painted colourful 'Hungry Caterpillars', honed their fine motor skills with playdough fun and kinetic



sand, constructed amazing creative items and played really well using turn taking and sharing. It is a pleasure to see these fantastic important lifetime skills developing.

Reading and comprehension competence for all students is rocketing. Everyone is making very good progress and spelling marks are through the roof due to students' hard work and the valuable support of all parents.

In Maths this week we have experimented with blocks to discover the capacity of different sized containers. Number activities have also been undertaken to consolidate the understanding of skip counting sequences.

In English students wrote about a Butterfly's life cycle. Preps are learning all about magic e, making i say its long sound.

Next week is our first of 4 Prep Orientation days. We can't wait to welcome our 2026 Preppies. Year 1's are looking forward to working in Mrs Gibbons' classroom.

Year 2-3 News - Mrs Melanie Gibbons

We have learnt a lot of new skills this week! The Year 3's have started to learn about mapping in greater detail. They have practised looking at different objects from a bird's eye view and started to understand the difference between 2D and 3D. We have also started to look at food and fibre production as part of our Design Unit. The Year 3's

are very interested in how their chosen food is produced and have made some discoveries about how foods such as potato chips and coco pops are made.

In Maths, we have been looking at how to read time on both analogue and digital clocks. Some of the concepts have been tricky, but the students are doing well with grasping duration and time.

We are practicing writing compound sentences in English and have used some amazing and tricky words. Both Year 2 and Year 3 are given a stimulus in which to write a persuasive text. They have been practising writing in paragraphs and are doing very well. This week's topic was convincing parents to pay children pocket money for chores! We had some interesting responses.





Our swimming notes went out in Monday's homework folders. Could you please ensure you have filled in both pages and return these ASAP. The students are looking forward to these lessons.

Year 4-6 News - Mrs Gasparin and Mrs Favaro Mrs Gasparin

The students have started to use persuasive language and techniques to persuade me to visit different counties, towns, dislike bats and love Taylor Swift. The students are very creative and have picked up on how to write a persuasive letter very quickly. The students have been using rhetorical questions, emotive language and other persuasive techniques to analyse and write persuasive texts.

The students have been working hard in Maths. They have grasped the concept of following patterns and writing patterns really well. Year 4 have also done well to apply a range of mathematical skills to find unknown numbers in addition and subtraction questions. Keep up the great work, Year 4.

Science is always fun. The students were archaeologists and used tools to dig up hidden items. The students have been amazed about how there are three main types of rocks (igneous, sedimentary and metamorphic rocks) and from there, there are numerous



types of rocks under those main headings. We will continue to research and investigate rocks and soil.

On Wednesday morning, the Year 6 students attended an online meeting in preparation for their camp in week 4. The Call to Adventure stage requires a pre-visit by staff from Tallebudgera to meet the students and invite them on a learning journey. Tallebudgera staff introduced the Hero's Journey, explored different types of heroes, explained what is required to prepare for the journey and identified the personal challenges that they may





face on their camp journey. Students will be provided with a "Journal" to record details of their "Journey" which will be used throughout the camp experience to reflect on their learning.

Today in HaSS students began creating an information guide comparing Australia and Indonesia as part of their assessment. They will investigate the diverse characteristics of these two countries to create an information guide for exchange students.

In Science we are continuing to explore energy and electricity. After testing the components of the 'Steady Hand Game' last week, students are now required to choose an energy source to generate electricity to run the rides and games at two destinations - a desert area and an island. Students used their science knowledge to choose an appropriate energy source for the show in each of the different locations.

Our dance lessons continued yesterday afternoon which are a highlight of our week.
