



Year 1-2 News - Mrs Goodwin

We've had a wonderful and engaging fortnight in our classroom, filled with creativity, exploration, and hands on learning!

Visual Arts

Students have been creating vibrant *hand pattern art*, using their hands as the outline and decorating them with colourful patterns and designs. Their artwork is bright, detailed, and a great celebration of their individuality.



HASS

In Humanities and Social Sciences, students have been discussing *toys from the past*. We explored how toys have changed over time and compared them with the toys children enjoy today. Students loved sharing what they know and imagining what life was like for children many years ago.

English

We are continuing to develop our *sentence writing skills* by focusing on capital letters, finger spaces, full stops, and writing clear, meaningful ideas.

Mathematics

- **Year 1:** Students have been practising *counting to 50* and using *MAB blocks* to represent numbers. They are building a strong understanding of tens and ones.



Year 2: Students have been learning about *sides and corners of shapes* and identifying *parallel lines* in 2D shapes and in the world around them.

Year 3-4 News - Mrs Gasparin/Mrs Cannon

The students have continued to come to school with a positive attitude to learning. They have approached all tasks with confidence and pride. They should be proud of how they are completing their homework, writing tasks and their maths work.

In English the students have continued to explore literary devices like onomatopoeia, alliteration and hyperbole. They have been finding these in texts and writing their own examples, they are very funny. I wonder if your child can remember some and share them with you.

In Maths, the students have concluded their study of mapping. They all did very well. It was an enjoyable topic to learn about. They were able to map their classroom, get up and pace out their directions. The Year 4 students learnt about symmetry and rotational symmetry. They were experts by the end and were able to find and create their own patterns and shapes with rotational symmetry.

In Science, Year 3 and 4 continue the exploration of life cycles, including the human life cycle and animals and their young.

This links to our questions in Design about what food is grown in Stanthorpe and how agricultural technologies are used. Both Science and Design is proving to be an engaging topic, and the students are asking great questions and making connections to push our learning forward.

Year 5-6 News - Mrs Favaro

Congratulations to our Year 6 students who were presented with their leadership badges and senior shirts on Wednesday at our School Leaders Badge Presentation Ceremony. We look forward to their contributions to the school as they step into their leadership roles for the year ahead.

This week in HaSS, students explored the values demonstrated through the actions and behaviours of Peter Lalor on the goldfields. We compared Australia's democracy with the values of our own school community.

Today in Science, students investigated how animals use camouflage to survive in their environments and examined the structural adaptations of plants that enable them to thrive in different conditions.
